Minutes of the 13th State Level High Powered Steering Committee (SHPSC) of Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) held on 14th December 2017 in the Committee Room of the Chief Secretary, Government of Kerala.

The meeting of the 13th State Level High Powered Steering Committee (SHPSC) of AMRUT chaired by Dr. K.M. Abraham IAS, Chief Secretary, Government of Kerala, commenced at 05.00 pm. (List of Participants enclosed as Annexure I)

Sri P S Mohammed Sagir, Mission Director of AMRUT, presented the points in the agenda one by one and after detailed deliberations, following decisions were made.

Agenda Item No. 1. Approval of Minutes of the 12th Meeting of SHPSC

Decision : The Committee approved the minutes of 12th meeting of SHPSC held on 31st October 2017.

Agenda Item No. 2. Action taken report on the decisions of the 12th meeting of SHPSC held on 31st October 2017

The Committee noted the Action Taken Report on the decisions of the 12th SHPSC held on 31st October 2017.The Committee has also given its agenda and additional decisions on the Action taken report items.

AGENDA & DECISION 2.3: Energy Audit for Water Systems

As part of AMRUT reforms, the Ministry of Urban Development has directed to take the support of Energy Efficiency Systems Limited (EESL) to conduct energy audit of water pumping systems and replace inefficient pumps in all AMRUT cities. SHPSC observed the need for the energy audit and pointed that the assets of water supply systems is owned by KWA hence the energy audit of the nine AMRUT cities has to be steered by KWA in the nine AMRUT cities. The contract agreement among KWA, Mission Directorate and EESL has to be finalized and signed up at the earliest.

The Chairman directed Secretary, Water Resources to expedite the signing of agreement between Kerala Water Authority, EESL and Mission Directorate for conducting energy audit.

Action taken: The Mission Director vide Ltr No.14/17/SMMU/PM dated 23.10.2017 requested to the Managing Director of Kerala Water Authority to expedite the issue.

A meeting was arranged by the Principal Secretary, LSGD on 4th November 2017 attended by Mission Director, AMRUT, Kerala Water Authority and EESL, in which MD, KWA has agreed that the draft of the



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tripartite agreement will be issued within 4 days to Principal Secretary, with copies to all parties of the agreement. As there is no response received from KWA, a reminder letter was issued to KWA on 24.11.2017 and the reply is still pending.

Decision: The Chairman expressed his displeasure to the Secretary, Water Resources, in the delay in signing the agreement with EESL and KWA and asked to provide the deadline to which Secretary replied that it will be finalised tomorrow itself.

AGENDA & DECISION 10: APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTY DIRECTOR (PROJECTS)

In order to guide the Mission Directorate regarding the governmental procedures, liaison with para-statal agencies and Independent Review and Monitoring Agencies, advice in tendering and technical inspection of projects and appraising the variations in tender from time to time during the project implementation phase of AMRUT, a serving officer from KWA / PWD or LSGD was requested to be appointed on deputation in State Mission Management Unit.

The 10th SHPSC has directed Chief Engineer, LSGD to depute an officer from LSGD Engineering Wing not below the rank of Assistant Executive Engineer with M.Tech/MBA as Deputy Director (Project), SMMU, AMRUT. The Chief Engineer, LSGD nominated an Assistant Engineer in the LSGD, who is willing to take up the position.

Action taken: The Mission Director convened a meeting with the nominated officer Smt. Aswathi Vasudevan, Asst. Engineer, LSGD on 24.10.2017 and she expressed her willingness to take up the position. As such, a letter (reference SMMU/A/1/2015 dated 25.10.2017) has been submitted to the Principal Secretary requesting necessary orders to appoint Smt. Aswathi Vasudevan as Deputy Director (Projects) on working arrangement in AMRUT Scheme.

The Mission Director is now, awaiting final orders, from the Principal Secretary, LSGD.



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Decision: The Committee directed the matter to be discussed with the Principal Secretary and obtain a final decision in this regard.

AGENDA & DECISION 3 A: Web Based Project Monitoring

The 11th SHPSC meeting has decided that a web based project monitoring system shall be developed with the help of National Informatics Centre or similar agency, enabling the tracking of welldefined milestones for each project under AMRUT. The committee insisted that web based project monitoring system need to be operational from 15.11.2017.

Action taken: Smt. Bhagavathy Iyer, IT cum M&E Expert has consulted Sri. Ajith Brahmanandan, Senior Technical Director and the team of National Informatics Centre and detailed the requirements. Further to this, the Mission Director and the Director of Urban Affairs also have interacted with the State Informatics Officer of NIC to customize the project monitoring tool (POINT) being developed by NIC to suit the requirements of AMRUT.

> Several consultation meetings have been conducted with NIC officials and required data to develop the trial software / monitoring system has been provided to NIC and the software development in progress. NIC has requested for support personnel for the customization and maintenance of the AMRUT portal.

> In addition to this, the Mission Directorate is regularly updating progress in the online monitoring portal of MoHUA which is helpful in assessing the State's present position.

As per the Mission Directorate statement that the Project Monitoring will be integrated with the 'UNNATHI' website, the Chairman notified that a presentation on the same shall be arranged in the next SHPSC meeting.

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Decision:

AGENDA & DECISION 4: OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR AMRUT PROJECTS

The Mission Directorate has prepared operational guidelines for the institutional building and timely implementation of projects, reforms and capacity building activities proposed under AMRUT. The guidelines prepared were circulated in the SHPSC.

The Committee appraised the Operational Guidelines and advised to incorporate the timelines of GIS mapping in AMRUT Cities and the Energy Audit of Water Pumps with responsibilities assigned to Chief Town Planner (Planning) to deliver the GIS Mapping Progress and KWA to complete the energy audit of Water Pumps. The operational guidelines shall also specify the final decision taken for according Administrative and technical Sanction for all the projects sector wise and the payment modalities for the projects to be clearly defined.

Action taken: The Mission Directorate has finalized the operational guidelines incorporating the comments raised by the Committee and an amended version is attached under

Decision: The Committee approved the Operational Guideline subject to a subject to by the Principal Secretary, LSGD for comments if any.

AGENDA No. 3: TRIPARTITE AGREEMENT WITH KMRL FOR URBAN TRANSPORT & PARKS PROJECTS IN KOCHI AND KOZHIKODE CORPORATIONS.

In the 7th SHPSC held on 14.07.2017, it was decided to formalize the tripartite agreements between the Secretaries of Corporations of Kochi & Kozhikode – Kochi Metro Rail Limited (KMRL) – The Mission Director, AMRUT towards the implementation of Urban Transport & Park Projects in Kochi and Kozhikode Corporations.



Accordingly, the draft tripartite agreement is prepared and submitted by KMRL to Mission Directorate with the following conditions:

- 1. 50% advance payment of contractor's project cost.
- 2. 70% interim payments of centage charges.
- 3. 5-8 % of centage charges for end to end support.

As there is a dispute in the issue, 13th SLTC has decided that the matter may be placed before this SHPSC for review and approval.

Decision: The SHPSC observed that the conditions put forth by KMRL are conflicting with the existing standard guidelines and Government Orders issued for the consultancy services of execution of public works with other Government accredited agencies. Therefore the proposed conditions by KMRL are against the Finance Department's guidelines and hence are not acceptable. As such, KMRL shall be exempted from end to end support for the Urban Transport and Parks projects in Kochi and Kozhikode. The cities may select the consultant through open bidding at the earliest.

However, the Principal Secretary informed that he will discuss the issue with KMRL Managing Director Sri. Mohammed Hanish and if KMRL agrees with the GO stipulations (GO(P) No. 61/2017/Fin dated 9.5.2017), the projects can be taken up through KMRL.

AGENDA No. 4:

ADDITIONAL STAFF PROPOSAL BY KERALA WATER AUTHORITY FOR AMRUT PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

The Managing Director, KWA has submitted their proposal vide reference No. KWA/JB/P-III/27/2017 Part I dated 28.11.2017 to the Mission Director, for additional staff required in 111 water supply projects (1221.78 Cr) in 9 ULBs undertaken by KWA and is 79 Nos. @ 2 years, amounting to Rs. 5.26 Cr.

The SLTC has recommended the following modified proposal, for additional staffs to KWA:

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Decision: The Chairman approved the proposal recommended by the 13th SLTC, with acceptance from MD, KWA and Secretary, Water Resources Department. The Committee also directed the Mission Directorate to release advance payment as per the requirement of KWA for the mobilization of the additional staffs.

The appointment of the additional staff shall also be in conformance with the GO No. 56/2017/Fin dated 28.4.2017 in terms of positions, remuneration, terms and conditions etc.

AGENDA No. 5: DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE HON'BLE MINISTER OF LSGD IN AMRUT ACTION PLAN MEETING HELD ON 27.11.2017, 2:30 PM AT HIS CHAMBER.

The Hon'ble Minister has convened a meeting on 27.11.2017 at 2.30 pm in his chamber to evaluate the present progress of AMRUT projects and its relative performance with other states in India.

Having found out that Kerala's performance drastically low, the Hon'ble Minister has expressed his displeasure and urged the following immediate steps to be implemented after discussions in the SHPSC meeting:-

- 1. Fast track plans by KWA, ULB, Mission Directorate, LSGD Engineering wing, Urban affairs department etc... for joint coordination and effective implementation of the project within the approved timeline.
- 2. Urban affairs director shall monitor the progress of the project and issue necessary direction from time to time to ULB Secretaries and display the project status update in website.
 - Urgent steps shall be taken up by water authority for issuing technical sanctions, tendering, work award etc., and a separate team shall be delegated for this task.

The current TS according system by Technical Expert Committee (Parks and Urban Transport projects) induces considerable delay and hence to be changed. Therefore, in Municipalities, the



technical Sanction shall be granted by the Executive Engineer level to Rs.50 lakhs and, in Corporations, the TS sanction shall be granted by the Superintending Engineer up to Rs:2 Crores. For projects above Rs.2 crores, the TS sanction shall be granted by the LSGD Chief Engineer. This shall apply to all Storm Water Drainage, Urban Transport and Parks projects.

- 5. The Mission Directorate shall provide a report on the delay by KWA in water supply project implementation.
- 6. To bring in better competition and professionalism, consultants for DPR preparation may be chosen through open, tender, in addition to the empanelled list of LSGD.
- 7. There is lack of engineering and supporting staff in the mission cities and KWA for implementing AMRUT project. So proposals have to be taken from LSGD Engineering Wing and KWA regarding additional manpower required.
- 8. Mission Directorate shall conduct review meetings with each ULB and report shall be submitted.
- **Decision:** The SHPSC confirmed the decisions of the Hon'ble Minister.

AGENDA No. 6: STORM DRAINAGE PROJECT UNDER KANNUR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION (SAAP 2017-18) – CONSTRUCTION OF SEA-SHORE STRUCTURES AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS - ENTRUSTING THE WORK TO HARBOUR ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

> The Storm water drainage (SAAP 2017-18) project, i.e, Construction and rejuvenation of primary drains & secondary drains at Thottadathodu and connecting drains, Varam, varam vayal, Katampallipuzha and connecting drains, sea shore structures as per the requirement at Payyambalam, Aayikkara, Mukkadav, Kadallai areas for eliminating sand deposits, under Kannur Municipal Corporation has been recommended for AS in the 14th SLTC held on 05/12/2017.

> The location of sea shore structures and related lands are under the possession of Harbour department & this type of construction (break



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water structures in the sea) is a specialized work which also requires expertise from Harbour department.

Therefore, the Kannur Municipal Corporation has requested to entrust the project to the Harbour Engineering Team, from end to end support, i.e technical sanction, tendering, work award, execution etc.through a Tripartite agreement.

The matter has been discussed in the Kannur corporation council dated 04/12/2017 and decided to address the matter to government. Corporation's Deputy Mayor had discussed this matter with the Principal Secretary during the SLTC held on 05/12/2017.

Decision: The SHPSC accepted the proposal of entrusting the project to Harbour Engineering team for end to end support as per the standard procedures of Government accredited agencies and GO guidelines issued by Finance Department.

- DPR Preparation of all projects by KWA shall be completed by 15.12 2017
- AS approvals of all SAAP projects shall be completed by 31.12.2017.
- TS approvals of all SAAP projects except water supply shall be completed by 31.12.2017.
- Water Supply projects shall be accorded TS by 15 01 2018
- Tendering and Contract awarding to be completed by March 2018

Decision: The SHPSC has revised the time frame for activities as per the following:

- DPR Preparation of all projects except those by KWA shall be completed by 05.01.2018
- DPR Preparation of all projects by KWA shall be completed by 15.01.2018
- AS approvals of all SAAP projects shall be completed by 31.01.2018

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- TS approvals of all SAAP projects except water supply shall be completed by 15.02.2018.
- Water Supply projects shall be accorded TS by 15.02.2018
- Tendering to be completed by March 2018

The Committee expressed its deep concern about the time delays occurred for the activities defined in the last SHPSC and informed that the performance of the responsible officers are not upto the level of adhering the specified timelines. The Principal Secretary stated that the AMRUT Mission team (SMMU & CMMUs) is not exerting pressure to ULBs for the achievement of DPR preparation which was originally scheduled to be before 30 November 2017. If there had been a vigorous coordination with the ULBs and KWA, the milestones would have been accomplished. Therefore, the Principal Secretary issued a revised deadline for completion of DPRs of all projects except KWA by 5th January 2018, a failure wherein will lead a deduction of 20% from the salaries of the staff of SMMU and CMMUs. Each SMMU staff shall also be assigned charges of Mission Cities individually and provide a direct coordination to achieve the target.

To lead, the Mission Director shall liaise with the city of Kochi and urge them to achieve the target before 5th January 2018. The following SMMU staff shall be in charge of the other cities.

The Principal Secretary also informed that if any ULB do not submit the pending DPR before 5th January 2018, the projects will not be taken up further. Therefore, letters to be issued to Hon'ble Mayors and Secretaries to comply with the deadline.

The Committee also noted the following discussions:

KWA stated that the tendering of 33 projects will take place before 15th January 2018 out of which 10 projects will be immediately awarded and the remaining 23 projects will be awarded before 15th January 2018.



- 2. 80% of Consultancy fee for DPR preparation shall be disbursed to the ULBs as an advance payment, to facilitate the cash flow, through RTGS. No treasury cheque transaction shall be made.
- 3. The Mission Directorate shall address the Government for the releasing the AMRUT State Budget of 2017-18 to the account of the Mission Directorate.
- 4. The Chief Engineer LSGD shall submit a revised proposal for additional staff requirement not as cadre appointment but positions on contract basis for the project implementation, before the next SLTC for evaluation and recommendation to SHPSC.

Agenda No. 8: ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTION OF DPRS

In the 13th SLTC held on 14.11.2017, 15 DPRs amounting to Rs. 58.07 Cr were reviewed and recommended to be placed before the SHPSC to accord Administrative Sanction (AS).

In the 14th SLTC held on 05.12.2017, 33 DPRs amounting to Rs. 268 Cr were reviewed and recommended to be placed before the SHPSC to accord Administrative Sanction (AS). List of projects attached as *Annexure-II*.

Decision :The SHPSC discussed the projects in detail and decided to accord Administrative Sanction to 48 projects amounting to Rs. 326.07 cr. SHPSC also directed to take immediate steps to expedite the process of issuing Government order for AS.
