As per OM No. K-16015/22/2017/AMRUT-II dated 28.03.2024, the MoHUA released the final installment (₹207.225 Cr.) of the central share of AMRUT-1.0 to the State. In the OM, it is mentioned that the amount released should be utilized for the purpose for which it has been sanctioned, and Utilization Certificates may be furnished within six months. In this regard, it may be noted that six months is a very short period for completing all the balance works of AMRUT-1.0. Moreover, the 35th SHPSC held on 06.02.2024 had directed to complete the works transferred from AMRUT-2.0 to AMRUT-1.0 and submit the Utilization Certificates by Mar-2025. Under the circumstances, a request (Letter No. A1-869/16/AMRUT dated 08.04.2024) was sent to the National Mission Director, AMRUT for a time extension until Mar-2025 to complete the balance works of AMRUT-1.0 and submit the Utilization Certificates. In this regard, the Principal Secretary, LSGD has also sent a request (D.O Letter No. DC1/321/2022-LSGD dated 17.07.2024) to the National Mission Director, AMRUT. Reply has yet to be received from MoHUA regarding time extension of AMRUT-1.0. The expected month of completion and expenditure of the balance 146 works of AMRUT-1.0 is as follows:

Completion by Sep-2024: 84 works - ₹ 65.67 Cr.

Completion by Dec-2024: 58 works - ₹ 220.74 Cr.

Completion by Mar-2025: 4 works - ₹ 27.35 Cr.

Issues:

The 100 MLD Water Treatment Plant (WTP) being constructed at Vasoorichira, Kollam Corporation is nearing completion and can be commissioned. In order to commission the WTP, the following works under KIIFB need to be completed.

➤ Laying of 1219 mm raw water pumping main from intake well at Njankadavu to WTP: 27km completed out of 28.13km, for the balance pipe laying from Nanthirickal to Elamapalloor along NH-183 the permission of MoRTH is to be obtained.

➤ Supply and erection of raw water and clear water pump sets with allied electrical installations, and transformer building: approval of tender excess (38.96%) is required from the Govt. for the bid received.

- * The committee took note of the progress and directed as follows:
 - Necessary efforts shall be taken by ULBs and KWA to complete the balance AMRUT-1.0 works within the deadline given by the MoHUA.
 - Any liability due to incompletion of the works within the deadline will have to be borne by the ULB and not by the State.
 - The committee directed the ULB Secretaries to monitor the progress of all balance works and ensure the completion of works within the deadline.
 - The committee directed the Joint Managing Director, KWA to monitor the progress of balance KWA works and ensure the completion of works within the deadline.
- * The committee took note of the issues and directed as follows:
 - The issues regarding the balance KIIFB works to be completed for commissioning the WTP at Vasoorichira shall be discussed with the CEO, KIIFB for deciding the way forward.

Subsequently, in the meeting chaired by the CPE, KIIFB, on 15.07.2024, the KWA was directed to submit the request to the Govt. for approval of tender excess regarding the raw water and clear water pump set works and to obtain permission from MoRTH for the balance laying the raw water pumping main through micro-tunnelling. The KWA has submitted the request to the Govt. on 29.07.2024 (Letter No. KWA-JB/1549/2024-AE9) for approval of tender excess. As per the estimate prepared by KWA for laying the balance (nearly 1 km) raw water pumping main the amount required for doing the work through micro-tunnelling is nearly Rs.28 Cr. which is seven times more than the amount required to do the work through open cutting. The Principal Secretary, LSGD, has requested the Secretary, MoHUA (D.O Letter No. 264/DC1/2023-LSGD dated 17.07.2024) to intervene to obtain the permission of MoRTH for laying the pipeline through open trenching.

Decision:

- * The committee took note of the progress and decided as follows:
 - Necessary efforts shall be taken by ULBs and KWA to complete the balance AMRUT-1.0 works within the deadline given by the MoHUA.
 - Any liability due to incompletion of the works within the deadline will have to be borne by the ULB and not by the State.
 - The ULB Secretaries shall monitor the progress of all balance works and ensure the completion of works within the deadline.
 - The Joint Managing Director, KWA shall monitor the progress of balance KWA works and ensure the completion of works within the deadline.
 - A document showing the outcomes of major projects implemented under AMRUT-1.0 shall be prepared.
- The committee took note of the issues and the action taken, and decided as follows:
 - A detailed note on the issue related to the MoRTH shall be submitted to the Chief Secretary so that the matter can be taken up with the ministry.

Agenda Item No.36.4.1: <u>Guruvayur Municipality – WS Sector – Risk & Cost Rearrangement of Work:</u>

As per letter no. E5/13618/18 dated 04.07.2024 the Secretary, Guruvayur Municipality, requested to place the agenda for approval of rearrangement of the below-mentioned work at the risk and cost of the contractor, M/s. Kalamdarsha Constructions Pvt. Ltd., and for the award of the work to the contractor, Mr. C.P. Vinod Kumar. The details are as follows:

- ❖ The cost due to tender excess shall be recovered from the contractor, M/s. Kalamdarsha Constructions Pvt. Ltd.
- ❖ Any excess amount over the risk and cost arrangement shall be borne by the ULB

Decision:

The committee took note of the recommendations of the SLTC and decided as follows:

- ❖ Approved the rearrangement of the work at the risk and cost of the contractor, M/s. Kalamdarsha Constructions Pvt. Ltd.
- ❖ The cost due to tender excess shall be recovered from the contractor, M/s. Kalamdarsha Constructions Pvt. Ltd.
- ❖ Any excess amount over the risk and cost arrangement shall be borne by the ULB.

Agenda Item No.36.4.2: Palakkad Municipality – Various Sectors – Foreclosure & Cancellation of Works:

As per letter dated 04.07.2024 the Secretary, Palakkad Municipality, requested to place the agenda for approval of pre-closure of 4 works and cancellation of 2 works. The details are as follows:

- B) Name of Main Work: Meattupalayam Street Drain
- · Sector: SWD
- **AS Amount:** ₹0.70 Cr., [G.O. (Rt) No. 3530/2017/LSGD dated 02.11.2017]
- The work was split into 2 parts:
 - * Sub Work-1: ₹0.50 Cr. completed
 - Sub Work-2: Near Jos Alukkas to be cancelled
 - Apportioned AS Amount: ₹0.20 Cr.
- Council Approval: Council Resolution No.2 dated 16.12.2022

- was split into 3 parts and tendered.
- Construction of riverside walkway along Kalpathy river bank Part-1 which was not started was cancelled vide G.O. (Rt) No. 3259/2022/LSGD dated 31.12.2022.
- Both the sub works, Construction of riverside walkway along Kalpathy river bank Part-2, and Construction of riverside walkway along Kalpathy river bank Part-3 were awarded to M/s. KSIE.
- The contractor started both the sub works and did side protection works for some portion of the river bank and a part bill of ₹6.327 Lakh was paid to contractor under the work, 'Construction of riverside walkway along Kalpathy river bank Part-2'. Later the contractor stalled both the sub works.
- Even after multiple reminders the 2 sub works were not restarted by the contractor and hence the Council held on 26.09.2023, as per Resolution No. 47, decided to terminate the contract and rearrange the work at the risk and cost of the contractor and also to black list the contractor.
- The work was then retendered 3 times but no bids were received.
- Since the deadline for submission of Utilization Certificate of AMRUT-1.0 works is September 2024, the council held on 26.06.2024 as per Resolution No.1 decided to cancel the sub work 'Construction of riverside walkway along Kalpathy river bank Part-3' and foreclose the sub work, 'Construction of riverside walkway along Kalpathy river bank Part-2'.
- The Sub Work-2 of the Meattupalayam Street Drain could not be executed in the originally proposed location as the area is a congested one (to be executed between boundary wall and building).
- There is already a pipe drain in this portion constructed by the private owner which serves the purpose.
- The recently tarred road will have to be excavated for diverting/extending the drain along the road which may lead to public protest
- The council held on 16.12.2022 reviewed the matter and decided to cancel the Sub Work-2.
- Agenda in this regard was placed in 27th SLTC and the committee decided that the decision on cancellation of the sub work will be taken based on the report of the DDC on the ownership of the land through which drain is passing.
- Tahsildar's report, Village Surveyor's report and copy of the deed which shows that the land is under private ownership have been submitted by the ULB to the DDC. The DDC report regarding the ownership of the land is yet to be obtained.
- Since the deadline for submission of Utilization Certificate of AMRUT-1.0 works is September 2024, the request for cancelling the sub work is placed in this SHPSC.
- C) Name of Work: Kotta Maidhanam Cheriya Kotta Maidhanam Phase-2 – to be foreclosed
- · Sector: Park

The work involves construction of gate, installation of benches & waste bins, laying of paved stones, laying of interlock tiles and providing railings. Later as per the request from Kerala State Ex-service League the

- construction of a war memorial statue was added to this work.
- The work was planned to be implemented in two parts, the first part comprising of works like construction of gates, installation of benches & waste bins and laying of paved stones were completed. The second part comprises of construction of war memorial statue (Apportioned AS Amount: ₹5 Lakh).
- The construction of war memorial statue was tendered and only one bid was received. Selection notice was given to the contractor on 18.10.2022. But even after giving multiple reminders, the contractor did not enter into an agreement with the ULB for the work.
- Hence the ULB decided to encash the EMD amount given by the contractor and retendered the work after recasting the estimate. But even after 3 retenders no bids were received.
- Hence the Council held on 26.06.2024 as per Resolution No.1 decided to foreclose the work.
- D) Name of Work: Paved Footpath along Stadium Bye-pass IMA Road to be foreclosed
- · Sector: UT
- AS Amount: ₹0.73 Cr. [G.O. (Rt) No. 5/ 2018/ LSGD dated 01.01.2018]
- Council Approval: Council Resolution No.1 dated 16.12.2022
- The work involves providing & laying of interlock tiles and construction of handrails along the footpath.
- All works except the hand rail works were completed.
- Handrail work was initially awarded to another contractor in 2010 under the ULB's own fund and the contractor had filed a case at the district court regarding the work due to which the handrail work could not be done under AMRUT-1.0.
- Hence the Council held on 26.06.2024 as per Resolution No.1 decided to foreclose the work.
- E) Name of Work: Aiswarya Nagar Park to be foreclosed
- · Sector: Park
- AS Amount: ₹0.25 Cr. [G.O. (Rt) No. 3652/ 2017/ LSGD dated 13.11.2017]
- Council Approval: Council Resolution No.1 dated 16.12.2022
- The work involves construction of open stage, toilets, installation of play equipment, benches & waste bins, providing and laying of interlock paving tiles and construction of an internal drain.
- All the works except providing and laying of interlock tiles and construction of internal drain were completed.
 - Public protest that arose at the time of construction of internal drain stalled the work. After a meeting with the public, it was decided to avoid the internal drain work.
 - At this stage the contractor backed out of work and the Council decided to terminate the contract and rearrange the work at the risk and cost of the contractor.
 - The work was then retendered 3 times but no bids were received.
 - Since the deadline for submission of Utilization Certificate of AMRUT-1.0 works is September 2024, the council held on 26.06.2024 as per Resolution No.1 decided to foreclose the work.

The committee decided to recommend the following to the SHPSC:

- If a project under AMRUT is closed prematurely, the expenditure incurred up to foreclosure can be booked under AMRUT. In case, the ULB would like to carry out the remaining work, further expenditure has to be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ In cases where a project closure is due to the inability of the ULB to arrange the balance work at the risk and cost of the contractor, the expenditure incurred has to be borne by the ULB.
- * The Chief Engineer, LSGD, has to review all such projects and take appropriate decisions.

Decision:

The committee took note of the recommendations of the SLTC and decided as follows:

- ❖ If a project under AMRUT is closed prematurely, the expenditure incurred up to foreclosure can be booked under AMRUT. In case, the ULB would like to carry out the remaining work, further expenditure shall be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ In cases where a project closure is due to the inability of the ULB to arrange the balance work at the risk and cost of the contractor, the expenditure incurred shall be borne by the ULB.
- * The Chief Engineer, LSGD, shall review all such projects and take appropriate decisions.

Due to the presence of these cables and due to the proximity of the NH Flyover and a drain (2m depth), work was temporarily stopped as enough space was not available for the construction of the exit pit. Agenda Item No.36.4.7: Thrissur Corporation – WS Sector – Approval for Taking the Help of FCRI:

The Hon'ble Mayor, Thrissur Corporation, requested the 31st SLTC that the ULB be allowed to take the technical help of Fluid Control Research Institute (FCRI) for the WS work, 'WET Upgradation', within the approved AS Amount (₹8.58 Cr.), as it will be helpful in the formation of District Metered Area (DMA) under the work.

31st SLTC Decision:

The committee directed Thrissur Corporation to submit a detailed report regarding the assistance required from the Fluid Control Research Institute (FCRI) for taking a decision on the matter.

Subsequently, as per the letter dated 17.07.2024, the Hon'ble Mayor, Thrissur Corporation, informed as follows:

- The KWA is facing problems in finalizing the automation, monitoring and SCADA components under the work, "WET Upgradation', and has not issued TS for these components even though the AS was issued nearly 5 months ago.
- As per the previous experience of Thrissur Corporation in WET and WER Phase-2 projects, the Fluid Control Research Institute (FCRI) can play a crucial role as technical partner in SCADA and flow related projects.
- * The FCRI has shown interest in providing technical assistance for AMRUT projects.
- Hence the expertise of FCRI can be utilized for pre-DPR study, DPR preparation, tender document preparation, tender evaluation and post work evaluation.

As the KWA is the implementing agency for the work, a letter (no. SMMU/33/2022-DMD1 dated

18.07.2024) was sent to the Managing Director, KWA requesting to provide the remarks of KWA on the matter. The reply of KWA is awaited.

Deliberation:

- ➤ The Joint Managing Director, KWA, informed that the KWA agrees to the proposal of Thrissur Corporation to take the technical help of FCRI.
- > The Principal Secretary, LSGD, informed that the amount required for engaging FCRI has not been informed by the Thrissur Corporation.

Decision:

The committee decided to allow the Thrissur Corporation to take the technical help of the Fluid Control Research Institute (FCRI) for the WS work, 'WET Upgradation', subject to the condition that any excess amount over the AS amount due to the engagement of FCRI in the work shall be borne by the ULB.
